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□ About Linked book

Linked book is a version of a Link list that also contains replay components. The Linked book is created by converting a Link list into a Linked book in Link-it Create.

Program independent

Linked books can be opened and replayed in a computer without any of the programs Link-it Create, or Link-it Use being installed. If the Linked book is placed on a CD it will automatically be started when the user inserts the CD in the computer.

Limited viewing

The person who created the Linked book has selected viewing mode and play mode for the Linked book. This cannot be affected by the user.

However, the user can change some functions, like highlighting links in the text, text size and whether the video shall be played in full screen mode or not.

No bookmarks can be created

The users of the Linked book cannot create their own bookmarks or enter information of their own for the links in the Linked book.



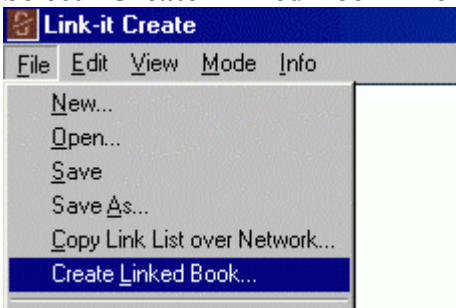
□ Create a Linked book

The function "Create a Linked Book" will create a Linked book based on the Link list you have open. In the dialog the Linked book is given the name and location selected by you. The Link list you based your Linked book on is still there and is not affected by your having created a Linked book.

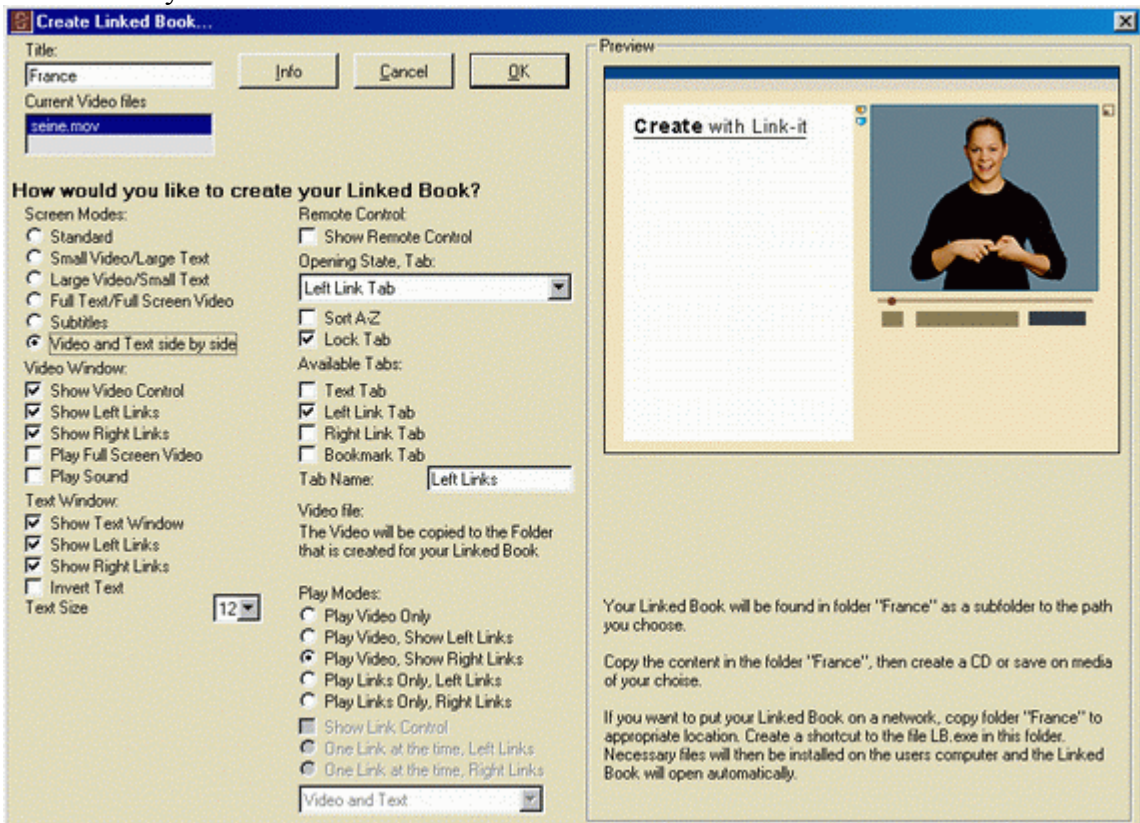
This is how you create a Linked book (the Link list you are using for the Linked book must be open and saved):

1. **Change to Create mode by clicking  if you are not already in Create mode** (the button with a link symbol to the left at the top of the screen).

2. **Select "Create Linked Book" from the "File" menu.**



3. **The "Create Linked Book" will now appear on the screen.** In this dialog you can control how you want the Linked book to look and work.



Title:

The name of your Link list has already been specified in the "Title" field. You can change this by just typing in another name.

Current Video files

The video files included in the Linked book are displayed in the "Current Video files" box.

If there are several video files in the box, the file marked in blue will be the first one that is shown when the Linked book is started. You can select which file should be the first one to be shown when the Linked book is started by clicking on it.

Screen Modes:
 Standard
 Small Video/Large Text
 Large Video/Small Text
 Full Text/Full Screen Video
 Subtitles
 Video and Text side by side

This is where you specify the layout of the book. To the right in "Create Linked Book" dialog, an image of how your choices affect the layout of the Linked book is displayed.

Video Window:
 Show Video Control
 Show Left Links
 Show Right Links
 Play Full Screen Video
 Play Sound

This is where you specify if the video buttons shall be visible.

If right links or left links shall be indicated with symbols next to the screen.

If the video shall be played in full screen.

If the sound shall be on or off.

Text Window:
 Show Text Window
 Show Left Links
 Show Right Links
 Invert Text
 Text Size

This is where you specify if you want the text window to be shown.

If links in the texts shall be underlined (show right links) and in bold (show left links).

If the text shall be inverted, i.e. displayed in white with black background.

The text size.

Remote Control:
 Show Remote Control

This is where you specify if you want the remote control to be visible.

Opening State, Tab:

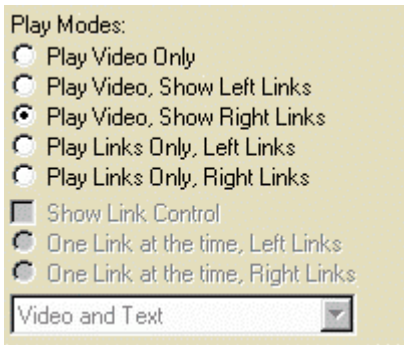
 Sort A-Z
 Lock Tab

This is where you specify which tab you want to be displayed first when the Linked book is started. You can also specify sorting order, and if the tabs shall be locked or change at the same time as the text is right clicked or left clicked.

Available Tabs:
 Text Tab
 Left Link Tab
 Right Link Tab
 Bookmark Tab
 Tab Name:

This is where you specify which tabs the user shall be able to use. If you choose only one tab, the Linked book will remove the remaining tabs. You are then also able to choose a name for the one tab.

If you select the bookmark tab, a dialog will be displayed where you specify the bookmark list that shall be included.

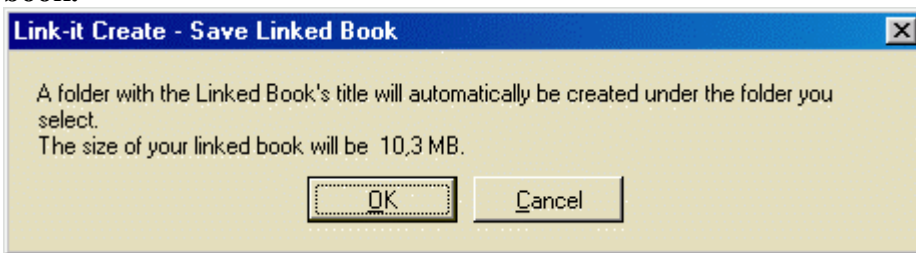


This is where you specify what is going to happen when the user clicks the video's play button. You can choose if right links and left links shall be highlighted when the video is playing. You can also choose that the video shall only play the links and skip unlinked parts.

If you have chosen subtitle under the heading "Screen Modes", you can show the Link control with which buttons the user can browse the links one at the time.

4. When the name and the configuration are correct, click  to the right at the top of the dialog.

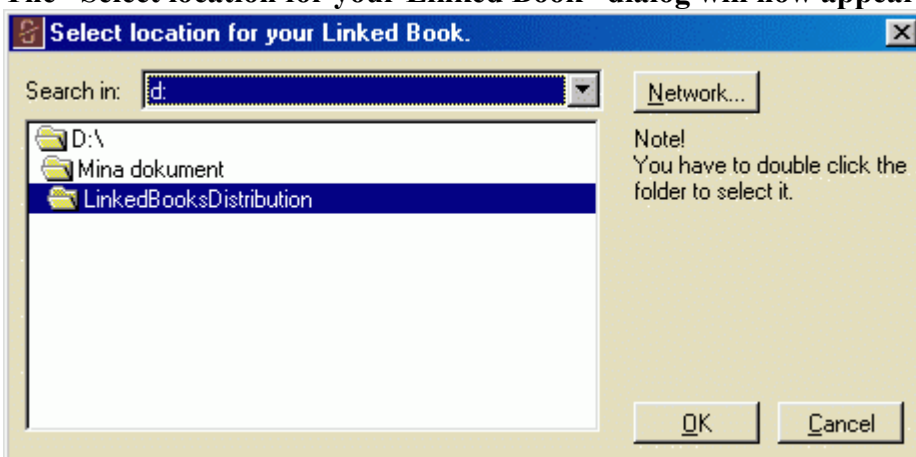
5. A dialog will now appear on the screen informing you of the size of the Linked book.




(Note: If your Linked book shall be copied to a CD it should not be larger than 700 Mb.)

Click .

6. The "Select location for your Linked Book" dialog will now appear on the screen.



Most often the suggested location is the most suitable choice. You can therefore click  without making any other choice.

Remember the location so that you can easily find the Linked book you have created. If you want to save the Linked book in another location than the one suggested, double



click your way to the folder in which you want to save the Linked book.
(When required you can select network disk by clicking the "Network..." box to extend it.)

- 7. **Link-it will now create your Linked book.** It may take a while since there are many files that need to be created and copied. The "Create Linked Book" dialog will be closed when the Linked book is completed.

If you are going to copy the Linked book to a CD you can read more about in the section "Export a Linked book" below.

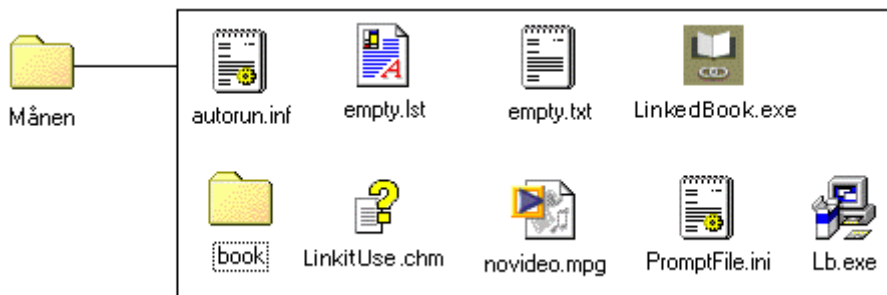
□ Export a Linked book

When you have created a Linked book you can use it together with other users if you place it on a network. You can also copy it to a CD and give it away.

The contents of a Linked book:

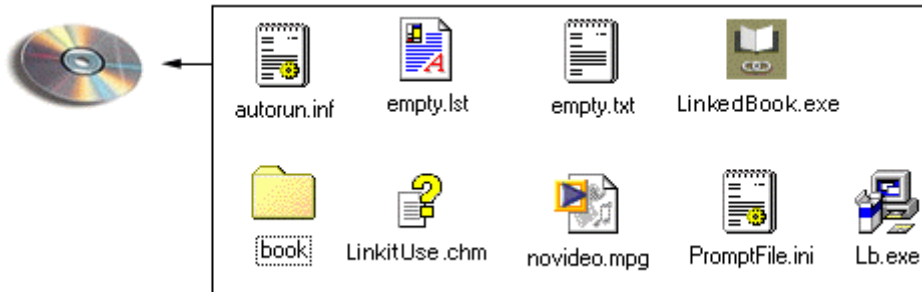
A Linked book consists of several files that are placed in a folder with the same name as the Linked book.

A Linked book contains the components necessary to run the Linked book without the user having to install the program Link-it on the computer. This is why more files are needed for a Linked book than a Link list.



Export to CD

The Linked book's components are created so that they easily can be placed on a CD. Place the contents of the Linked book's folder on the CD. The Linked book will start automatically when the user inserts the CD in the computer.



Starting the Linked book

When a CD with a Linked book is inserted into the computer it is started automatically. If it does not start automatically you can click the Lb.exe file the first time you want to start it. The following times you can click LinkedBook.exe.

Suggested formulation of installation text to a CD cover:

Installation:

The CD starts automatically.

If it does not start automatically: Click "This computer" and then the icon for your CD player. Click Lb.
